

GAE4DG Spiritual Director Message:

The Walk to Emmaus requires three things – faith, self-surrender and spirit of charity. Faith that something great is possible and will happen. Self surrender as we surrender ourselves to God and be truly present to Christ's working within us. And a spirit of charity and cooperation that binds it all together as we live in community and give ourselves fully to Christ. My pilgrim Walk was at Mt. Wesley in Kerrville, TX. I remember going up to the registration table where I signed in and got my name tag. Then I was whisked off to my room where my sponsor worked to get my things settled in my room before escorting me to a large room filled with 80 or so other women most of whom I didn't know. Then my sponsor gave me a hug and left me there – I was surrounded by people yet I felt completely alone. I felt like a kindergartner the first day of school

Soon as the retreat began and the leaders were quick to instruct us "Don't anticipate, just participate!" that became our mantra during the entire weekend..."Don't anticipate...just participate!" This is really much harder than it seems, especially for us control freaks! It is in our nature to notice patterns and routines and begin to anticipate the next thing. Why in the world would it be a bad thing to anticipate? Here is why; it is when we are looking ahead that we often miss the blessing of the moment. When we anticipate we effectively close our minds and hearts to the possibilities God has in store and we limit the wonder and miracles of the moment. When we anticipate we get sidetracked and miss out on the opportunity to act now. We may lose focus and miss what is happening right in front of us. By running ahead we may just miss the moment of blessing!

"Don't anticipate...Just participate!" I'm still trying! All these years later this Walk to Emmaus lesson is still so important to me. With God's help, every day I will participate fully in life. I will live in the moment. I will be fully present and aware of the many gifts of love, life and grace that God is giving me right now!

GAE4DG Lay Director Message:

As the Board for GAE4DG enters a new year, our focus turns to encouraging all members to get more involved in the Emmaus movement. The primary purpose of Emmaus is to develop Christ-centered, servant leaders. A tremendous part of the leadership development in Emmaus, is through the post-Walk involvement in the community and serving on teams. Greater Austin Emmaus 4th Day Group - Board of Directors Meeting

The Greater Austin Emmaus 4th Day Group Board of Directors met on Thursday, June 10 at Riverbend Church. In attendance were: Gene McConnell – Lay Director; Sandy Brooks – Assistant Lay Director; Bob Duplantis – Member Support; Diane Merwarth – Walk Support; Roxie Greenway – Treasurer; Bud Broeker – SWTC Board Representative; Cortney Smith – Chrysalis Board Representative; Pastor Cheryl Broome – Spiritual Director; Jack Foreman – Immediate Past Lay Director.

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM by Gene McConnell, with an opening prayer by Cortney Smith. The minutes of the previous Board Meeting were approved as written on a motion by Bob Duplantis, seconded by Jack Foreman.

The Board welcomed the new Spiritual Director, Cheryl Broome.

The finance report was given by Roxie Greenway, and was approved by a motion from Diane Merwarth with a second from Bob Duplantis. Ending balance as of 5/31/10 is \$4536.87.

Bud Broeker gave a conference report. Walk Flight Leadership training is scheduled for July 31. Proposed leadership for 2011 walks was presented. February Women's Walk Lay Director – Lori Foster, Board Rep – Sandy Brooks; March Men's Walk Lay Director – Rocky Wilcox, Board Rep – Bud Broeker; September Women's Walk Lay Director – Gina Franklin; Board Rep – Roxie Greenway; October Men's Walk Lay Director – Jack Foreman, Board Rep Gene McConnell. A motion was made by Bob Duplantis and seconded by Diane Merwarth to approve the 2011 Walk leadership. The motion passed. Bud Broeker will follow up with the conference to obtain the contract with Camp Young Judea. Bob Duplantis will prepare a list of guidelines for the walks at CYJ. The Board discussed their concerns with The Gift which is to be presented at Welcome Back following each Walk. Gene McConnell and Jack Foreman will draft a letter to the SW Conference Board regarding the Board's position on the requirement to present The Gift.

Gene McConnell asked each Board member to prepare a list of positions to report to them and to begin recruiting members to those positions. Roxie will assist in defining the various positions reporting to each Board member.

Diane Merwarth announced that we do not have child care scheduled for the next few walks for candlelight or closing. Cheryl Broome asked that we create a committee position to address this issue so that child care can be provided on Walks. Diane announced that she will be setting up a book and information table at each gathering.

Bob Duplantis reported that he is continuing to obtain the necessary information to set up a different email messaging system.

Cortney Smith reported that there are currently 10 butterflies scheduled on the girls Flight in July, but that help is needed on the cook team for the boys Flight.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:00 PM with a closing prayer by Pastor Cheryl Broome.

Heat and Humidity

In our part of the country summer brings sweltering heat and high humidity. We walk out of an air-conditioned building and face a blast furnace of hot, humid air. Sweat begins to pour out and we hurry to seek air-conditioned shelter. Heat and humidity create an environment that controls our life.

Christians face the "heat and humidity" of a hostile world. Our Lord warned His disciples to expect persecution. Peter speaks of a "fiery trial" the early Christians could expect (1 Peter 4). We too face a culture that causes us trouble. But within the fellowship of God's people we gather around Word and Sacrament, experiencing God's cool refreshment before we walk out into the hostile world. As Jesus tells His disciples, "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world" (John 16)

When faced with the blast furnace of temptation and ridicule, we begin to sweat. But Jesus, who resolutely faced the world's hatred and went to the cross in payment for our sins, offers us strength to face the world's heat and humidity. We can live boldly in the midst of the world's anti-Christian culture as He continues to refresh us in the airconditioning of worship with God's people.
