## **Advent's Waiting Lessons**

Many of us may have failed at Advent last year. This year we will try again to not let Advent wane too early because we resist the idea of waiting.

We love the Advent readings at church, the prophecies about Emmanuel. But Advent waiting faces a mighty competitor called December, when we visit with friends and relatives we haven't seen for months. We keep up with our neighbors by getting out the ladder and lights. We shop, wrap, stamp and sing. How could we wait? Christmas would run us over.

We can do it, however, by hanging out at God's house, not just at Christmas parties and holiday sales. Advent waiting is mostly about God waiting for us to be born into new life, to re-enter the joy and despair of the world around us.

God heals our Advent waiting pains with stories of ... waiting. During December we are reminded of the vision of our waiting by Isaiah. Tucked into the beginning of Luke is another waiting story. Zechariah and Elizabeth, getting on in years, waited so long for a child they forgot they were waiting. But God remembers the desires of our hearts.

Zechariah was offering incense in the sanctuary when an angel appeared. The angel promised Elizabeth and Zechariah a son, and foretold the gladness that his birth would inspire. Zechariah, jaded by waiting, expressed doubts. Really, Zechariah, you want more of a sign than an angel next to the altar?

Zechariah paid with his voice, perhaps more of a gift than a punishment. Waiting involves becoming quiet. It takes some quiet time to hear the words God gives us. In the end, waiting in hope helped steep Elizabeth's and Zechariah's proclamations that they finally shared aloud with God's people. "This is what the Lord has done for me ...." Elizabeth testified. "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has looked favorably on his people and redeemed them," Zechariah prophesied (Luke 1).

Baby Jesus will arrive at Christmas, whether or not we "succeed" in our Advent devotion. Jesus is born, and it is the advent of our salvation.
